<p>Rhododendron <i>Rhododendron</i></p> <p>*for part shade areas</p>	<p>4-6 feet tall 3-5 feet wide</p>	<p>Evergreen</p>	<p>One of the most popular flowering shrubs for shade. Dense green foliage year-round and large, showy flowers in spring. Flowers may be white, pink, red, purple, or soft yellow.</p>	
<p>'Sundance' Mexican Orange <i>Choisya ternata</i> 'Sundance'</p> <p>*for part shade areas</p>	<p>4-8 feet tall 4-8 feet wide</p>	<p>Evergreen</p>	<p>Aromatic, chartreuse-yellow leaves that grow in groups of 3. Fragrant, orange-scented, white flowers in spring.</p>	
<p>Camellia <i>Camellia sasanqua</i> or <i>japonica</i></p> <p>*for part shade areas</p>	<p>6-10 feet tall 4-8 feet wide</p>	<p>Evergreen</p>	<p>Somewhat slow-growing shrub with year-round interest. Dark green, glossy leaves and extremely showy flowers in late fall/winter/early spring. Flowers can be red, white, pink, or two colors.</p>	

<p>Holly Osmanthus <i>Osmanthus heterophyllus</i></p> <p>*for sun or part shade areas</p> <p>(it is said to handle heavy shade, but we have not tried this)</p>	<p>8-10 feet tall 6-8 feet wide</p>	<p>Evergreen</p>	<p>Small, white, fragrant flowers in fall. Holly-like green leaves. Foliage is not always very dense, so you may see through it somewhat.</p>	
<p>Hicks Yew <i>Taxus media 'Hicksii'</i></p> <p>*for part sun or part shade areas</p>	<p>10-12 feet tall 3-4 feet wide</p>	<p>Evergreen</p>	<p>Grows slowly with a narrow, columnar habit. Foliage is dense, glossy green, and needle-like and grows on long, upright branches. Bright red berries in autumn add nice color and contrast.</p>	
<p>Boxleaf Azara <i>Azara microphylla</i></p> <p>*for part sun or part shade areas</p>	<p>12-18 feet tall 6-8 feet wide</p>	<p>Evergreen</p>	<p>Tree with fountain-like, arching shape. Tiny, shiny, green leaves year-round. Tiny, yellow, vanilla-scented flowers in late winter. Foliage is not always very dense, so you may see through it somewhat.</p>	

<p>Green Giant Arborvitae <i>Thuja 'Green Giant'</i></p> <p>*for part sun or part shade areas</p>	<p>30-40 feet tall 8-12 feet wide</p>	<p>Evergreen</p>	<p>Dense, cedar-like tree with pyramidal shape. Green foliage has gold tinge in winter. Can be left natural or pruned for tighter growth.</p>
